Goodwill Day Pots of Hope rules:

- A maximum of 15 teams will be permitted to enter.
- Teams must provide their own pots, ingredients, equipment and utensils.
- Food prepared will be donated and should serve 10 people.
- Vegetables may be sliced, diced, chopped or shredded beforehand, but food should be cooked in a pot at Kingsmead College on Goodwill Day.
- Charcoal/wood will be provided. Gas may also be used if provided by contestants.
- Fires may be lit from 08h30 and food should be ready for judging at 12h00.
- Judging criteria will include taste, presentation, originality, preparation and hygiene.
- The judges decision is final.
